Confucius: Through lens of late Kashi Ram Sharma

On a rain-washed afternoon, the academic fraternity of the New Delhi gathered at the India International Centre to delve into the life and wisdom of the great Chinese sage, Confucius. The occasion was marked by the release of a remarkable anthology authored by the late prof. Kashi Ram Sharma, former head of the Department of Chinese and Japanese Studies, University of Delhi.

The prominent professors actively contributing to the discussion were profs. Anita Sharma, K. Warikoo, Damodar Panda, Nabin Panda and Janardan Sahu. The anthology is a testament to years of profound scholarship and owes its publication to the tireless efforts of his son, Maj. Gen. Pat Rahul Sharma, whose dedication ensured that his father's intellectual legacy reached the world.

Few individuals in world history have left as lasting and pervasive an imprint on a civilization as Confucius has on China. Born as Kong Qiu (c. 551–479 BCE) in the Spring and Autumn era, he is celebrated not merely as a philosopher but as the very conscience of Chinese civilisation. His vision of ethical life and humane governance formed the moral architecture of Chinese society for more than two millennia. To the Chinese people, Confucius is not a distant historical figure; he is a living presence whose values continue to pulse through their social, political, and cultural bloodstream.

Late professor Kashi Ram Sharma, an eminent scholar of Chinese studies, captures this centrality with unusual clarity in his comprehensive anthology. He emphasises that Confucian ideals are deeply ingrained deeply in the China's civilisational DNA. To understand China, its history, or its cultural identity, without reference to Confucius is to miss its innermost soul. His book is opening a window for Indian readers into a philosophy that has shaped one of the world's great civilizations. Confucius lived in unsettled times.

The Zhou feudal order was crumbling, and moral decay seemed widespread. His response to this turmoil was to retrieve and revive the ethical wisdom of earlier ages. He re-articulated the wisdom of

the past; he breathed into it a vitality that enabled it to endure far beyond his lifetime.

At the heart of his teaching was the cultivation of virtue, humaneness, benevolence, moral rectitude, ritual propriety, and sincerity were the guiding stars of his thought. He felt that good governance began with the moral self-discipline of rulers. A king, Confucius maintained, should lead through the force of his example rather than the power of coercion. Social harmony began in the family. The well-governed family became the model for the well-governed state.

One of his most memorable ethical insights is what scholars later called the "Silver Rule": *Do not do to others what you would not want done to yourself.* Behind this apparently simple maxim lies a universal principle of empathy and reciprocity that resonates across cultures and continues to inspire moral reflection worldwide.

After his death, during the Warring States period, his teachings competed with other intellectual currents. Under the Qin dynasty, they were even suppressed. Yet, with the rise of the Han dynasty, Confucianism was enthroned as state orthodoxy. For centuries thereafter, imperial China institutionalised his philosophy as the moral compass of governance and society.

Even in the modern age, when Confucian thought was denounced during both the Republican period and the early decades of Communist rule, it resurfaced in the form of New Confucianism, recast for a global context. From the dynasties of antiquity to the People's Republic today, the sage's shadow has never left China.

Professor Sharma's contribution is especially significant for the Indian scholars because he views Confucius through a cultural lens. He observes that while Buddhism traveled from India to China and deeply enriched Chinese spiritual and philosophical life, Confucius's influence never crossed into India. This absence has left a void in Indian understanding of Chinese civilization. His anthology aims to bridge that gap, making Confucian philosophy intelligible and relevant to Indian readers, scholars, policymakers, and the broader intellectual community.

In a world where China's influence on international affairs grows with each passing year,

Sharma's study acquires renewed urgency. To engage with China today - whether politically, economically, or culturally, requires engagement with the intellectual foundations that continue to shape its society. Confucius, far from being a relic of antiquity, still informs ideas of leadership, morality, and governance in the present.

For India, the dialogue with Confucian thought is more than an academic exercise. Just as Buddhism once crossed the Himalayas to enrich China, an encounter with Confucian values can provide India with insights into ethical leadership, humane governance, and social harmony. In opening this channel, Sharma's book performs the crucial role of cultural diplomacy: building bridges of understanding between two of the world's oldest civilisations. Ultimately, *Confucius: The Sage Reformer & Visionary of China* is more than a scholarly volume. It is a cultural bridge, a work that encourages comparative thought, and a reminder that wisdom of the past remains vital in shaping the present and the future. Meticulously researched yet written in an engaging style, the book extends over 476 pages and is published by Manohar. Priced at Rs. 2,500, it stands as both a serious academic contribution and a timeless guide for anyone seeking to comprehend the enduring relevance of Confucius.



Telangana's Rs 12,000-Crore Drug Surprise Party

From spice to substance
Move over Silicon Valley. Hyderabad, the land of biryani, IT parks, and minor power outages, has now entered the chat as the newest darling of India's synthetic narcotics industry. In a crackdown that makes most Bollywood thrillers look under-researched, the Mira-Bhayandar Vasai-Virar (MBVV) Police - yes, they do exist - have unearthed a staggering Rs 12,000 crore worth of synthetic drug materials from what was passing off as just another industrious chemical unit in Hyderabad's Cherlapally Industrial Estate.

What were they cooking? Mephedrone. Also known as MD. Not to be confused with MD degrees, which are hard to get legally!
From bus stops to busts
It all started not with an intelligence tip or a high-tech sting, but with a 23-year-old Bangladeshi woman caught with 105

grams of mephedrone near a bus stop in Kashimira, Mumbai. Fatima Murad Sheikh alias Molla (as if one name wasn't enough) was merely the opening act. As police followed the peddlers up the food chain, things got spicier than a Hyderabad mirchi bajji.

Another 178 grams of MD and almost Rs 24 lakh in cash later, detectives stumbled upon the South Indian connection. What followed was a month-long investigation involving more patience than a Tollywood plotline and more twists than a Telugu serial.

Not your average chemistry class
At the heart of this meth-masquerade were two gentlemen: Srinivas Vijay Voleti and Tanaji Pandharinath Patwari, allegedly running the drug unit out of what was supposed to be a harmless-sounding lab-Waghdevi Labs. Located in an industrial estate,

the lab looked about as suspicious as a mid-level startup. No beanbags, but plenty of beakers.

The lab was, in fact, less about science and more about business-producing MD by the kilo. When the MBVV Cell-4 team stormed the place, they didn't just find narcotics; they found a full-blown pharmaceutical Disneyland: 5.9 kg of mephedrone, 27 mobile phones, three cars, one bike, four electronic scales, and enough raw chemical stock to make Walter White blush.

Criminals with LinkedIn potential
Twelve arrests were made, from street hawkers to lab operators. There's every possibility that some had no idea whether they were stirring cough syrup or cooking narcotics. But ignorance doesn't weigh much in court.

According to MBVV Commissioner Niket Kaushik, this wasn't your usual petty peddler case. "We reached the manufacturers," he said, a line likely to be repeated with self-satisfaction at several conferences and at

least one family wedding. **Drugs, diplomacy, and bad PR**

This incident comes at a particularly awkward time for Telangana, which has been trying to rebrand itself as a tech and investment hub, not a Breaking Bad spin-off. Perhaps someone in PR should've intervened earlier: "Come for the AI parks, stay for the MD labs."

As for Maharashtra's role, this may be the biggest drug bust in the state's history - and possibly the first time anyone from Mira Road was taken this seriously.

Hence, members can attend and participate in the AGM through VC/ OAVM only.

3. In line with the aforesaid Ministry of Corporate Affairs (MCA) Circulars and SEBI Circular, the Notice of AGM along with Annual Report 2024-25 is being sent only through electronic mode to those Members whose email addresses are registered with the Company's Depositories. Members may note that Notice and Annual Report 2024-25 has been uploaded on the website of the Company at www.radaan.tv. The Notice can also be accessed from the websites of the Stock Exchanges i.e. BSE Limited and National Stock Exchange of India Limited at www.bseindia.com and www.nseindia.com respectively and the AGM Notice is also available on the website of CDSL (agency for providing the Remote e-Voting facility) i.e. www.evotingindia.com.
